## OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST THE KING

20<sup>th</sup> November 2021

### Gospel: John 18:33-37

'Are you the king of the Jews?' Pilate asked. Jesus replied, 'Do you ask this of your own accord, or have others spoken to you about me?' Pilate answered, 'Am I a Jew? It is your own people and the chief priests who have handed you over to me: what have you done?' Jesus replied, 'Mine is not a kingdom of this world; if my kingdom were of this world, my men would have fought to prevent my being surrendered to the Jews. But my kingdom is not of this kind.' 'So you are a king then?' said Pilate. 'It is you who say it' answered Jesus. 'Yes, I am a king. I was born for this, I came into the world for this: to bear witness to the truth; and all who are on the side of truth listen to my voice.'

### The Feast of Christ the King

The Church celebrates the Feast of Christ the King, also called the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, on the last Sunday of the Liturgical year. The Feast was established by Pope Pius XI in 1925 with his encyclical *Quas primas*, to respond to a world that was rejecting Christ and was being dominated by secularism. Pope Pius hoped that the establishment of this feast would bring about the following:

- That this annual celebration would assist the faithful to gain strength in their true King, Jesus Christ;
- That leaders and nations would recognise that they are bound to submit and give respect to Christ the King;
- That nations would see that the Church has the right to freedom, and immunity from the state.
- That individuals should honour and recognise Jesus as their 'Sovereign King' and emulate his total gift of self, perfectly embodied on the Cross. In imitation of their thorn-crowned King, individuals can help bring love and relief to those who suffer and help to proclaim the Good News of the Reign of Christ in the world today.

## **Pope Francis' at Angelus 14<sup>th</sup> November 2021:**

Speaking during the Sunday Angelus in St. Peter's Square, the Pope recalled the Gospel of Mark in which Jesus says "The sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light, and the stars will be falling from heaven." However, he continued, the Lord was not a doomsayer, His intention is to make us understand that sooner or later everything in this world passes except for God's love and the Gospel's saving message.

***A guide for the important things in life*** The Pope said this valuable message guides us in the important decisions in life. Urging us not to give too much value to things that give us immediate satisfaction, and not to be too attached to things that pass, "like money, appearance, physical well-being," he said it is important to go beyond the immediate, with patience, and build one's life doing good. The invitation he said, is not to build your life on sand: "According to Jesus, the faithful disciple is the one who founds his life on the rock, which is His Word." Quoting from Saint Paul, the Pope said "*Love never ends*" and he reminded us that "Those who do good, are investing in eternity."

***Building Heaven on earth*** "When we see a person who is generous and helpful, meek, patient, who is not envious, does not gossip, does not brag, is not puffed up with pride, does not lack respect, (*Cor 13:4-7*), this is a person who builds Heaven on earth. They may not be noticed or have a career, and yet, what they do will not be lost because good is never lost, it lasts forever," he said. Thus, the Pope continued, that to base one's life on His Word "is not an escape from history, but an immersion into earthly realities in order to make them solid, to transform them with love, imprinting on them the sign of eternity, the sign of God." He concluded by inviting believers to make important choices bearing this in mind: "Before deciding, let us imagine that we are standing in front of Jesus, as at the end of life, before Him who is love. Imagining ourselves there, in His presence, at the threshold of eternity, we make the decision for today. It may not be the easiest, the most immediate, but it will be the right one."

***Christ is present in the poor*** After the recitation of the Marian prayer, the Pope recalled that today we celebrate the Fifth World Day of the Poor. He reminded those following that it was established "as a fruit of the Jubilee of Mercy." "Christ is present in the poor," he said, adding that "The cry of the poor, united to the cry of the earth," resounded in recent days at the United Nations Climate Change Summit, COP26, in Glasgow. "I encourage those with political and economic responsibilities to act now with courage and foresight," the Pope said, and he highlighted the fact that today, on the World Day of the Poor, registrations open for the *Laudato si' Action Platform* that promotes integral ecology.

## **Summary of Pope Francis General Audience – 17<sup>th</sup> November 2021:**

Dear Brothers and Sisters: In this year of Saint Joseph, today we begin a new series of catecheses on the humble carpenter of Nazareth, the foster-father of the child Jesus and the patron of the Universal Church. In Hebrew, the name Joseph evokes God's power to bring about growth and new life. Joseph teaches us to trust in God's providence quietly at work in our world. His life is principally associated with two small towns, Bethlehem and Nazareth, reminding us that God's preferential love is for the poor and those on the margins of life. God chose Bethlehem, the city of David, as the place where his Son was to be born under the watchful care of Joseph, who was himself of the house of David. By his life and example, Saint Joseph reminds us that, in our own day, the Church is called to proclaim the good news of Christ's coming, beginning with the existential peripheries of our world. The poor and forgotten in our midst can look to him as a sure guide and protector in their lives. Let us ask Saint Joseph to intercede for the Church, that we may always set forth anew from Bethlehem, in order to see and appreciate what is essential in God's eyes.

### **Gaining Indulgences for the Holy Souls in Purgatory in November**

By a decree of 28 October, the Apostolic Penitentiary in Rome has extended to the entire month of November the possibility of obtaining plenary indulgences for the Holy Souls in Purgatory through the performance of specific indulgenced works.

These being:

- 1) a visit to a cemetery during which prayer is offered mentally for the faithful departed; and/or
- 2) a visit to a church or oratory during which one Our Father and one Creed are recited.

Usual conditions apply, these being that the person obtaining the indulgence for the faithful departed be in a state of grace and detached completely from sin, and have at least once gone to confession, received communion, and prayed for the Pope (not necessarily all on the same day) in the 20 days before or after the indulgenced work.

### **Marriage and Family Life:**

Marriage is not just a relationship but a vocation and a means of holiness. Please pray for married couples, those preparing for marriage (especially those who have had to defer weddings), and those who have been widowed especially in the past year. The Brentwood Marriage and Family Life Facebook page (BrentwoodMandFL) will include interviews with couples from around the diocese. If you are experiencing difficulties in your marriage or would like to deepen your understanding of this vocation and each other, a number of organisations are able to help remotely during the lockdown, such as Retrouvaille, Marriage Care and Smart Loving.
