FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT. 'Laetare' Sunday. 19th March 2023

Gospel: John 9:1' 6-9. 13-17. 34-38

As Jesus went along, he saw a man who had been blind from birth. He spat on the ground, made a paste with the spittle, put this over the eyes of the blind man, and said to him, 'Go and wash in the Pool of Siloam' (a name that means 'sent'). So the blind man went off and washed himself, and came away with his sight restored. His neighbours and people who earlier had seen him begging said, 'Isn't this the man who used to sit and beg?' Some said, 'Yes, it is the same one.' Others said, 'No, he only looks like him.' The man himself said, 'I am the man.' They brought the man who had been blind to the Pharisees. It had been a sabbath day when Jesus made the paste and opened the man's eyes, so when the Pharisees asked him how he had come to see, he said, 'He put a paste on my eyes, and I washed, and I can see.' Then some of the Pharisees said, 'This man cannot be from God: he does not keep the sabbath.' Others said, 'How could a sinner produce signs like this?' And there was disagreement among them. So they spoke to the blind man again, 'What have you to say about him yourself, now that he has opened your eyes?' 'He is a prophet' replied the man. 'Are you trying to teach us,' they replied 'and you a sinner through and through, since you were born!' And they drove him away. Jesus heard they had driven him away, and when he found him he said to him, 'Do you believe in the Son of Man?' 'Sir,' the man replied 'tell me who he is so that I may believe in him.' Jesus said, 'You are looking at him; he is speaking to you.' The man said, 'Lord, I believe', and worshipped him.

Laetare Sunday/ Mothering Sunday

Today is the halfway mark of the Sundays of Lent. This Sunday is known as *Laetare* Sunday for the first word of the Entrance Antiphon *laetare* (rejoice); it is a Sunday of joy. The Church's liturgy, on this the 4th Sunday of Lent, invites us to retrace one of the fundamental dynamics of our baptismal re-birth through the Gospel account of the healing of the 'man born blind'. It is the passage from the darkness of sin and error to the Light of God, who is the Risen Christ. It is also Mothering Sunday when we remember and pray for all mothers both living and dead.

Angelus Message from Pope Francis on Sunday 12th March

At the midday Angelus on the Third Sunday of Lent, Pope Francis speaks about Jesus who is thirsty and the Samaritan woman at the well who gives Him water. The Pope explains how the Lord is also thirsty for our love as He promises to give us living water that makes eternal life overflow within us.

Thirsty like us

The Pope observed that Jesus' asking for a drink shows how in Him "God made Himself one of us, thirsty like us," sharing our human condition, needs, and suffering. *"In fact, Jesus' thirst is not only physical. It expresses the deepest thirsts of our lives, and above all, a thirst for our love. And it will emerge at the culminating moment of His passion, on the cross, where, before dying, Jesus will say: "I thirst.""*

Love quenches thirst

The Lord, who asks for a drink, also tells the Samaritan woman about the drink He can offer, the Holy Spirit's living water "that makes eternal life overflow within us." The Pope explained how, "thirsty for love, Jesus quenches our thirst with love," by meeting us in our daily life, sharing our own thirst, and promising us this living water of eternal life.

Giving others a drink

The Pope said we must follow the example of Jesus, who cries out to us, sometimes in silence, to quench the thirst of a brother or sister in need. Our family members, friends, or co-workers may often ask us for a "drink", but they are thirsting for closeness, attention, or a listening ear, the Pope explained. They may also thirst for the Word of God and need to find "an oasis in the Church where they can drink." This thirst is increased by the deserts of our frenetic societies, often marked by indifference and interior emptiness, the Pope observed. And this thirst can also literally be one for water, essential for our survival and that so many people around the world lack due to drought or contamination. Even our "common home," the environment, suffers from thirst caused by water scarcity or pollution.

Living water

The Gospel today offers us the promise of "living water" and calls each one of us to become a "refreshing spring" for our brothers and sisters, the Pope concluded. *"Today, therefore, we can ask ourselves: Do I thirst for God? Do I realize that I need His love like water to live? And then: Am I concerned about the thirst of others? May Our Lady intercede for us and sustain us on the way."*

Summary of Pope's Wednesday Audience on 15th March

Dear brothers and sisters: In our continuing catechesis on missionary zeal, we now consider the apostolic dimension of evangelization. In the Creed, we profess that the Church is "apostolic". An "apostle" is literally one who is "sent". In the Scriptures, we read that Jesus chose the twelve Apostles, called them to himself and then sent them forth to proclaim the Gospel. After his resurrection, he appeared to the Twelve and said: "As the Father has sent me, so now I send you", breathing upon them the Holy Spirit for the forgiveness of sins (*Jn* 20:21-22). Within the diversity of ministries and charisms in the Body of Christ, all the baptized are called and sent forth to advance the Church's apostolate. Those who are ordained have received the mission of teaching, governing and sanctifying in Jesus' name and authority, yet all the members of the faithful, as sharers in the Lord's priestly, prophetic and regal office, are called to be missionary disciples, "apostles in an apostolic Church". May the recognition of our common dignity and equality inspire us to ever greater unity and cooperation in proclaiming, by word and example, the good news of our salvation in Christ.

Prayer to St. Joseph - from the Apostolic Letter of Pope Francis, *Patris Corde* - With a Father's Heart

Hail, Guardian of the Redeemer, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary. To you God entrusted his only Son; in you Mary placed her trust; with you Christ became man. Blessed St. Joseph, to us too, show yourself a father and guide us on the path of life. Obtain for us grace, mercy and courage and defend us from every evil. Amen.

Migrants and refugees are human beings, not just statistics says Bishop. In 2023, people making dangerous journeys across the Channel to reach the UK are called by various names: 'refugees', 'asylum seekers', 'migrants', and often by more derogatory terms. Love the Stranger is a new publication by the Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales, Department for International Affairs that articulates our Christian duty to look beyond such labels and see the person who has left their homeland in search of a better life. You can download the document here: cbcew.org.uk/love-the-stranger. Bishop Paul McAleenan, Lead Bishop for Migrants and Refugees for the Bishops' Conference, emphasises the need to uphold their innate human dignity: "Our starting point as a society must be to recognise migrants and refugees as people. We need to understand their stories, their reasons for leaving their homelands and hopes for building a future here. "We should never view people arriving from elsewhere as a political problem to be solved, but rather as brothers and sisters who we have a responsibility towards, and who greatly enrich our communities. "People are driven to leave their countries, sometimes making dangerous journeys or risking exploitation, because of conflict, poverty, oppression, or lack of opportunities. Looking beyond our own borders, we have a duty to help people flourish in their homelands, as well as welcoming those who leave in search of a better life." Cardinal Vincent Nichols, President of the Bishops' Conference, welcomed the publication: "Love the Stranger draws together more than one hundred years of Catholic teaching to guide our response to migration in England and Wales today. While it does not propose detailed solutions to complex problems, it clearly calls for procedures which permit safe and controlled access and a fair hearing to those seeking asylum. Present arrangements in this country are dramatically lacking in both of these requirements."
